Eligibility to apply:

To be eligible to apply for a summer student position, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations
- Are currently enrolled in a post-secondary educational institution, on a full-time basis for the 2017-2018 academic year, returning to full time studies in the fall of 2018
- Are between 18 and 30 years of age (inclusive)
- Demonstrates an understanding of the South Asian culture
- Knowledge of South Asian languages – Punjabi, Hindi or Urdu are preferred
- Excellent working skills of MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint, internet and email
- Effective written and verbal communication skills as well as presentation skills
- Current first aid/ CPR certification is an asset
- Current police record check
- Provide TB test and up-to-date immunization documentation
- Criminal Record Search & Vulnerable Screening at their own expense
- are a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

Students will be required to produce valid/current student identification at the interview and will also need to present additional documentation at the mandatory orientation session. In cases where verification is unclear, further documentation may be requested from the Office of the Registrar.
